Coach (Retired)

Robin Selvig was a college women's basketball coach at the University of Montana, his alma mater, for 38 years. During his tenure, which lasted from 1978 to 2016, he accumulated 865 wins and only 286 losses. He had 36 winning seasons and 21 20-win seasons, winning 24 regular-season conference championships across three leagues: Northwest Women's Basketball League, Mountain West Conference, Big Sky Conference. Among all women's basketball coaches, Selvig finished his career ranked eighth in victories. When he retired, Missoula was ranked the 3rd toughest place to play in women's college basketball, ahead of South Bend, Chapel Hill and Palo Alto.
