Today is the 4th Sunday of Lent

The homily is an explanation of the readings, in particular the Gospel and how to apply this to our daily life. The homily can be given by a priest or deacon.

Churches may have 14 or 15 Stations of the Cross. If 15, it includes the Resurrection. The first 2 stations: Jesus is Condemned to Death, Jesus takes up His Cross

Transubstantiation: the offerings of bread and wine are changed into the Body and Blood of Jesus at the Consecration.

The Consecration is when the priest takes the host and then the chalice; elevates them and says, This is my Body/Blood, during the Eucharistic prayer.
