Today is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity

The Trinity is the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. 3 persons in one God.

We are required to go to Communion at least once a year. Confession is needed before if we are in a state of mortal sin. Venial sins are small sins and we are forgiven those when we pray the Confiteor at Mass. However, we should go to confession at least once a year, but realistically, it is better to go more often so little sins don't become big ones.

1849 Sin is an offense against reason, truth, and right conscience; it is failure in genuine love for God and neighbor caused by a perverse attachment to certain goods. It wounds the nature of man and injures human solidarity. It has been defined as "an utterance, a deed, or a desire contrary to the eternal law."

1855 *Mortal sin* destroys charity in the heart of man by a grave violation of God's law; it turns man away from God, who is his ultimate end and his beatitude, by preferring an inferior good to him. *Venial sin* allows charity to subsist, even though it offends and wounds it.

1857 For a *sin* to be *mortal*, three conditions must together be met: "Mortal sin is sin whose object is grave matter and which is also committed with full knowledge and deliberate consent."¹³¹

1858 *Grave matter* is specified by the Ten Commandments, corresponding to the answer of Jesus to the rich young man: "Do not kill, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Do not defraud, Honor your father and your mother."¹³² The gravity of sins is more or less great: murder is graver than theft. One must also take into account who is wronged: violence against parents is in itself graver than violence against a stranger.

There are a few opinions as to who wrote each Gospel. It's beyond what I can do here to fully explain it but if you have a study Bible, take a look and see what it says. Keep in mind, that though there is no official teaching on this, these books were inspired by God and included in our Bible to learn from them and grow in faith. Who wrote them is less important than the purpose they serve.
