FLOWERS

Sweet Alyssum Mary's Flower

These tiny flowers have a sweet aroma

Baby's Breath Our Lady's veil

The fresh aroma from these small flowers makes them a common choice for wedding bouquets and flower crowns

Begonia Mary's Heart

There is a breed of Begonia's called 'Angel Wing Begonia's'

Bleeding Heart The Passion of Christ

Because they resemble a bleeding heart this flower is associated with Christ's sacrifice on the cross

Bluebell Mary's Clothes

The deep blue color was believed to be where Mary got the dye for her clothes

Buttercup Our Lady's Locks

This lovely yellow plant is said to match the blonde hair of Our Lady

Calla Lilly St. Joseph's Staff

The Calla Lilly stands straight and proud, resembling the Staff St. Joseph used

Carnation Motherly Love; the Crucifixion

These grew from Mary's tears when she met her Son on the way to Calvary

Chrysanthemum All Saint's Day Flower

Believed to have bloomed outside of Christ's tomb, these flowers are also associated with All Saint's Day

Columbine Visitation

This flower grew in Mary's footsteps on her way to visit Elizabeth

Cosmos St. Michael's flower

Cosmos continue to bloom until the end of September, around the Feast Day of St. Michael

Crocus Blessed Virgin Mary

These flowers represent Mary's eternal youthfulness and purity. A select breed of the flower is cultivated for the spice Saffron

Daffodil Mary's Star

Resembles the Star of Bethlehem

Daisy (Oxe-Eye) Mary's Star

The simplicity of this flower was said to resemble the pure spirit of the Christ Child

Easter Lily Easter

This type of Lily blooms during the Easter season

Forget-Me-Not Mary's Eyes

Their light blue color is said to mirror Mary's eyes

Foxglove Our Lady's Gloves

The long, delicate bloom resembles a glove

Fuchsia Our Lady's Earrings

Legend says that these resemble the earrings worn by Mary, which Baby Jesus played with

Geranium Gentle Virgin

These flowers bloom in May, the month dedicated to Mary

Gladiolus Our Lady of Sorrows

Also known as a 'sword lily' these flowers resemble the sword that pierced Mary's heart

Hollyhock St. Joseph's Staff

This flower resembles the staff used by St. Joseph

Hosta Assumption

Blooms in late August around the Feast of the Assumption

Hyacinth Desire for Heaven

Based on the Ancient Greek myth that this flower would bloom over gravesites

Hydrangea Ave Maria

Depending on the color this flower can have many meanings, but the white bloom is most often associated with Mary

Iris Our Lady of Sorrows

The royal purple color and the sharp petals represent Mary's sorrow at the Foot of the Cross

Juniper Flight to Egypt

The Holy Family hid from their pursuers behind Juniper bushes

Lilac The Ascension

This flower bloomed under the Crucifix where Mary wept for her son.

Lily of the Valley Mary's Tears

These white lilies droop towards the ground, resembling tears. They formed under the Crucifix where Mary stood and wept.

Marigold Mary's Gold

This flower represents Mary's true wealth, which is her love for mankind. Marigolds also have many medicinal properties

Morning Glory Mary's Mantle

They resemble Mary's blue cloak

Pansy Trinity

Pansies not only have groups of three petals, but they are also tri-colored, representing the Trinity

Peony Pentecost Rose

Considered to be a rose 'without thorns'

Petunia Our Ladv's Praises

Petunia's come in many different colors; Mary loves and praises everyone

Rose Emblem of Mary

This flower has always been associated with Mary

Snapdragon Baby Jesus' Shoes

This fun bloom resembles a baby's shoe

Snowdrop Candlemas *Purity*

They bloom at the end of winter when we celebrate Jesus' Presentation in the Temple (Feb. 2nd)

Tulip Mary's Prayer

Before blooming the petals of the Tulip resemble hands in prayer

Violet Our Lady of Humility

Our Lady of Humility refers to images of Mary seated on the ground or a cushion (instead of a throne); Violets are a rich purple color and stay low to the ground.

Wisteria Our Lady's Bower

Mary and the baby Jesus took shelter from the hot sun under this large, blooming flower

White Lily Annunciation

The angel Gabriel often presents three white Lilies to Mary in depictions of the Annunciation

HERBS

Chamomile Our Lady's Flower

For its resemblance to a daisy and its many healing properties

Chives Our Lady's Garland

This plant has many medicinal properties and a lovely flavor

Cornflower Mary's Crown

For its beautiful blue petals, this herb has many medicinal properties

Dandelion Mary's Bitter Sorrow

The leaves of dandelion have a bitter flavor and are often seen in depictions of the Crucifixion

Lavender Mary's Drying Plant

When Mary left the Christ Child's clothes to dry on the grass, lavender grew in its spot

Marjoram Mary's Bedstraw

Mary used Marjoram to line the manger for the baby Jesus

Parsley Our Lady's Vine

Parsley leaves resemble Ivy, a long-lasting plant that represents God's eternal presence

Rosemary Mary's Posy; Mary's Bouquet

Because of its pleasant scent this plant was used by Mary as a personal bouquet

Sage Mary's Mantle

This medicinal plant has purple flowers which first appeared after Mary laid her cloak on the ground to rest

Thyme Our Lady of Humility

This herb grows low to the ground and has many medicinal properties



FRUIT

Cherries The Crucifixion

The bitter taste and red juice are a reminder of Christ's sacrifice

Figs The Escape to Egypt

During their escape the Holy Family ate from Fig trees

Oranges Mary's Fertility; New Eve

Believed to be the fruit from the Tree of Knowledge

Strawberry The Fruitful Virgin

The strawberry's shape resembles a womb
